### Office of Congressman Gerry Connolly 2014 Art Congressional Competition Guidelines

#### **General Guidelines**

- The competition is open to all high school students, however only students who are legal residents of the 11<sup>th</sup> Congressional District of Virginia may submit entries through my office. Please confirm that you are a resident of the 11<sup>th</sup> District before submitting an entry to my office. **To confirm your Congressional District, please visit:** <a href="www.house.gov">www.house.gov</a> or call my office at (703) 256-3071. If you do not live in the 11<sup>th</sup> District, please contact the Member of Congress who represents the district in which you reside.
- All artwork, including completed Student Entry and Release Form, must be received on or before Friday, April 11, 2014. Artwork may be delivered to either of my District offices:

- All artwork must conform to the following restrictions:
  - o All artwork must be finished, dry, and ready-to-hang
    - All pieces must include necessary hooks, wires, or other hardware for hanging.
    - Un-framed art must be cleanly mounted (strongly secured and flat) on a properly sized stiff board (foam core, carton board, paperboard, etc.).
    - Size of frame or boards must not exceed the size limitations and are considered part of the artwork.
  - Artwork must be two dimensional
  - o Each piece can be **no larger** than 28"x28"x 4" (28 inches high, 28 inches wide, and 4 inches deep) including the frame. Artwork cannot weigh more than 15 lbs.
  - Each entry must be original in concept, design, and execution and may not violate any U.S. copyright laws. Any entry that has been copied from an existing photo (not the student's own), painting, graphic, advertisement or any other work produced by another person is a violation of the competition rules and will not be accepted. Work entered must be in the original medium (that is, not a scanned reproduction of a painting or drawing).
  - o Please attach a label to the back of your artwork with your name, school, and artwork title.
  - Presentation of artwork is important; this is a judged competition and framed artwork will, in many cases, appear more finished and could compete more strongly. Craftsmanship counts.
- Artwork accepted mediums are as follows:
  - o Paintings: oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.
  - o Drawings: pastels, colored pencil, pencil, charcoal, ink, markers
  - o Collage: must be two dimensional
  - o Prints: lithographs, silkscreen, block prints
  - o Mixed Media: use of more than two mediums such as pencil, ink, watercolor, etc.
  - o Computer-generated art
  - Photography
- Each entry MUST be accompanied by the 2014 Congressional Student Entry and Release Form and the Workhouse Art Center Release Form.

#### **Exhibition and Awards**

- All artwork accepted will be publically displayed at The Workhouse Art Center, McGuire Woods Gallery (Building 16), 9601 Ox Road, Lorton, VA from April 23, 2014 through May 4, 2014.
- One 1<sup>st</sup> place winner from the 11<sup>th</sup> Congressional District of Virginia as well as 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> place winners will be announced during a reception to be held on Saturday, May 3, 2014 at The Workhouse Art Center in Lorton, Virginia from 2-4 pm. **The reception opens at 2 pm and the awards ceremony begins at 3 pm.**
- The 1<sup>st</sup> place entry will hang in the United States Capitol for an entire year.
- This piece must be delivered to the Capitol by May 27 (Congressman Connolly's office will handle the delivery) and cannot be returned for one year. Students who may need a piece for an exam portfolio or other purposes should consult with Congressman Connolly's Office.
- The final decision regarding the suitability of all artwork for the 2014 Congressional Art Competition exhibition in the Capitol will be made by a panel of qualified persons chaired by The Architect of the Capitol. Artwork must adhere to the policy of the House Office Building Commission. In accordance with this policy, exhibits depicting subjects of contemporary political controversy or a sensationalistic or gruesome nature are not allowed. It is necessary that all artwork be reviewed by the panel chaired by the Architect of the Capitol and any portion not in consonance with the Commission's policy will be omitted from the exhibit.
- The National Art Competition Reception for all Congressional District Winners will take place in June, 2014 in Washington, D.C. The exact time and location will be announced at a later date.
- Except for the winning entry, pieces can be retrieved from the office where they were submitted beginning after May 7 or call our office to make other arrangements.

### Workhouse Art Center Selection: "High School Rising Star"

- The Workhouse will select one artwork to display prominently on its campus. This artwork will be selected by The Workhouse Director of Visual Arts, and will be kept as loaned artwork for approximately one year after the exhibition. Students are encouraged to consider the presentation (e.g. framing) of their artwork for the competition.
- The Workhouse Director of Visual Arts will contact the artist directly to notify him/her if his/her piece was selected.
- If you do not wish your artwork to be considered for The Workhouse High School Rising Star selection, please indicate your wishes in the Opt-Out section of the Workhouse Art Center Release Form which is included in this packet.

## Office of Congressman Gerry Connolly 2014 Congressional Art Competition Frequently Asked Questions



#### 1. Who Can Participate?

Any high school student who lives in Congressman Connolly's District. All high school students in public, private, alternative and home-based schools are welcome. To confirm your Congressional District, visit: <a href="http://house.gov">http://house.gov</a> or call my office at (703) 256-3071.

#### 2. Do I have to be enrolled in an art class?

No. As long as you are eligible, you can participate.

#### 3. Do I have to create a piece just for this contest?

No. As long as it is your original work, the piece can be created at any time for any reason. Please see the contest guidelines for details on originality, dimensions, format, material, content, etc.

#### 4. So, I can just grab something I did two years ago and submit it?

Yes. As long it the piece meets **all** the other guidelines.

#### 5. Can submit a sculpture or a video?

No. Only paintings, drawings, collages, prints, photographs, and computer-generated art will comply with the size and weight limits. Please see the contest guidelines for details and contact my office if you have questions.

#### 6. Does it have to be framed?

No, but it must be ready to hang when submitted. All pieces must include necessary hooks, wires, or other hardware for hanging. Please see the contest guidelines for details.

#### 7. I need my piece for IB or AP or other exams in May. Can I get it back in time?

Yes, after May 7. We will need to hold your work from whenever you submit it (the deadline is April 11) through Sunday, May 4, 2014. The winning entry must be delivered to the Capitol on May 27 and must remain there for one year.
