## A BILL

- To require the head of each agency to establish a safety plan relating to COVID-19 for any worksite at which employees or contractors are required to be physically present during the COVID-19 pandemic, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Chai Suthammanont
- 5 Remembrance Act of 2021".

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## SEC. 2. WORKSITE SAFETY FOR FEDERAL EMPLOYEES AND CONTRACTORS.

3 (a) ISSUANCE OF POLICIES AND PROCEDURES BY 4 AGENCIES.—Not later than 60 days after the date of the 5 enactment of this Act, the head of each agency, in con-6 sultation with the Chief Human Capital Officer of the 7 agency and the Assistant Director of Administration of 8 the agency (or any individual holding an equivalent posi-9 tion) shall—

10 (1) establish, and publish on the website of that
11 agency, a safety plan containing procedures and
12 policies for—

- 13 (A) covered worksites; and
- 14 (B) being present at a covered worksite;15 and

(2) communicate such plan to each employee of
the agency and contractor of the agency (and any
subcontractor thereof at any tier) in such a manner
as to ensure that each such employee and contractor
acknowledges receipt and understanding of the plan.
(b) PLAN.—The safety plan required under subsection (a) shall, at a minimum, include the following:

(1) A description of the efforts of the agency
with respect to mitigating the spread of COVID-19
at covered worksites, including the following:

1	(A) A description of any personal protec-
2	tive equipment that is being or will be provided
3	by the agency to any employee of the agency
4	and contractor of the agency (and any subcon-
5	tractor thereof at any tier) physically present at
6	a covered worksite.
7	(B) A description of any procedures estab-
8	lished by the agency for—
9	(i) testing employees of the agency
10	and contractors of the agency (and any
11	subcontractor thereof at any tier) required
12	to be present at a covered worksite;
13	(ii) contact-tracing at covered work-
14	sites, including procedures by which such
15	employees and contractors (and any sub-
16	contractor thereof at any tier) will be noti-
17	fied of a potential exposure to an indi-
18	vidual who is diagnosed with COVID-19;
19	and
20	(iii) administering the COVID-19
21	vaccine to employees of the agency.
22	(2) Guidance on—
23	(A) any cleaning protocols to be imple-
24	mented at covered worksites;

(B) occupancy limits for covered worksites;
 and

3 (C) the use of appropriate face coverings
4 by employees of the agency and contractors of
5 the agency (and any subcontractor thereof at
6 any tier) while physically present at a covered
7 worksite.

8 (3) A description of the actions the agency is or 9 will be taking to protect from exposure to COVID-10 19 employees of the agency who conduct activities in 11 an official capacity while not physically present at a 12 covered worksite, including employees of the agen-13 cy—

14 (A) who are required to travel in an official15 capacity; or

16 (B) perform audits or inspections.

17 (4) A description of any requirements that
18 members of the public are required to meet in order
19 to enter a facility in which covered worksites are lo20 cated.

(5) A description of any alternative option to
being physically present at a covered worksite that
are available for employees who—

24 (A) have a high risk of contracting
25 COVID-19 (as determined by the Director of

1	the Centers for Disease Control and Preven-
2	tion); or
3	(B) live in a household with individuals
4	that have a high risk of contracting COVID-19
5	(as determined by the Director of the Centers
6	for Disease Control and Prevention).
7	(6) A description of any rule or protocol regard-
8	ing whether employees of the agency required to be
9	physically present at covered worksites are—
10	(A) required to be fully vaccinated before
11	being present at covered worksites; or
12	(B) allowed to take leave—
13	(i) to get each dose of the vaccine; or
14	(ii) upon experiencing severe side-ef-
15	fects as a result of receiving any dose of
16	such vaccine.
17	(7) Protocols that ensure the continuity of oper-
18	ations, including a plan to reverse any requirement
19	for an employee or contractor (or subcontractor
20	thereof at any tier) to be present at a facility in
21	which covered worksites are located if there is a
22	surge in COVID–19 cases in the geographic area of
23	such facility.
24	(8) The hotline website and hotline telephone
25	number of the Inspector General of the agency for

employees of the agency and contractors of the agency (and any subcontractor thereof at any tier) to report to the Inspector General any instance in which
the agency is not implementing the plan required by
this section.

6 (c) DELAYED APPLICABILITY FOR CERTAIN WORK-7 SITES.—For any worksite that the head of the agency has 8 temporarily closed due to COVID-19, the requirements of 9 subsection (a) shall be carried out not later than 30 days 10 before any employee of the agency or contractor of any 11 agency (or any subcontractor thereof at any tier) is re-12 quired to be physically present at such worksite.

(d) INSPECTORS GENERAL REPORTS.—Not later
than 6 months after the date of the enactment of this Act,
the Inspector General of each agency shall submit to the
Committee on Oversight and Reform of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security
and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a report on
whether that agency—

20 (1) has published and communicated the public
21 safety plan required by subsection (a), in accordance
22 with such subsection; and

23 (2) implemented such plan.

(e) APPLICATION.—Nothing in this Act shall be con strued to alter or otherwise limit the rights and obligations
 afforded under chapter 71 of title 5, United States Code.
 (f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

5 (1) AGENCY.—The term "agency" has the
6 meaning given that term in section 551 of title 5,
7 United States Code.

(2) COVERED PERIOD.—The term "covered pe-8 9 riod" means the period beginning on the date of the 10 enactment of this Act and ending on the date on 11 which the public health emergency declared by the 12 Secretary of Health and Human Services under sec-13 tion 319 of the Public Health Service Act (42 14 U.S.C. 247) as a result of the COVID-19, or any 15 renewal thereof, terminates.

16 (3) COVERED WORKSITE.—The term "covered
17 worksite" means a worksite at which an employee of
18 the agency or a contractor of the agency (or subcon19 tractor thereof at any tier) is required to be present
20 during the covered period.

(4) WORKSITE.—The term "worksite" means—
(A) in the case of an employee of the agency, the location of the employee's position of
record where the employee regularly performs
his or her duties, but does not include any loca-

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tion where the employee teleworks (as that term is defined in section 6501 of title 5, United States Code); and (B) in the case of a contractor of the agen-

cy (or subcontractor thereof at any tier), the location in a facility of the agency where the contractor or subcontractor performs his or her duties under a contract with the agency, or a subcontract thereof at any tier, as applicable.
