"(a) IN GENERAL.—The head of each agency shall

 that uses telework, flexibility in scheduling and work ar rangements, available technologies, or private and public
 sector partnerships to permit the agency—

- 6 "(1) to manage its personnel and continue its7 functions during emergencies; and
- 8 "(2) to enhance the ability of its personnel to9 telework during emergencies.
- 10 "(b) COLLABORATION.—In developing and sup11 porting its continuity of operations plan, the head of an
 12 agency may consult with—
- "(1) the Director of the Federal Emergency
 Management Agency and the Administrator of General Services, with respect to infrastructure needs
 (including information technology infrastructure);
 and

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"(2) the Director of the Office of Personnel
 Management, with respect to scheduling and work
 arrangements and other personnel matters.

4 "(c) TARGETS.—Not later than 6 months after the date of the enactment of this section, the Director of the 5 National Continuity Program of the Federal Emergency 6 7 Management Agency and the Chief Human Capital Offi-8 cers Council shall jointly develop a strategy for the effec-9 tive implementation of the continuity of operations plans of agencies under this section which sets targets for each 10 11 agency, including a proposed schedule for carrying out continuity of operations exercises to test the effectiveness 12 13 of such plans which may provide for the first such exercises to be held not later than 18 months after the date 14 15 of the enactment of this section.".

Page 16, strike line 23 and all that follows through page 17, line 2 and insert the following:

(2) an evaluation of the progress the agency
has made in meeting the targets for the implementation of continuity of operations plans as set forth in
section 6506(c) of title 5, United States Code (as
added by section 2), including an evaluation of the
effectiveness of the plan and timetable line that was
developed for the agency pursuant to such section in
